From Pastor's Report - Membership

- Gained 6 total members. Lost 12 members, including 6 deaths. Baptisms 2. Net changes: loss of 6 communicant members.
- Average worship attendance in 2022 was 77 per week.

Maintenance

New Business

- Church Website: We need volunteers to learn to do updates on the website.
- Scholarships. \$3,000 is allocated for scholarships for Christian education this year with \$1,000 maximum per person.

Pastor's Corner —

Worship

The season of Lent begins with Ash Wednesday worship on February 22 at 7pm. This midweek series titled, "His Final Steps", explores Jesus' final days before, during, and after his crucifixion using different location as themes for each service. signup sheet is set up in the narthex for those groups and families who would like to sign up to prepare and serve a meal.

Adult Bible Study

We have started a Bible History series on the book of 1 Samuel. These 8 lessons cover the birth of Samuel, the establishment of King Saul, David and Goliath, and more. Beginning this April, we will begin a series called, "Timely Topics: Timeless Truths." These timely topics include global warming, gender identity, close communion, and our dual citizenship. (Can my Pastor talk politics?) Our goal with these lessons is to equip ourselves to speak intelligently on these topics while also remaining faithful to what God's Word says.

Catechism Class

We have completed our study of baptism and continue with a unit on the Keys and Confession. Concerning forgiveness and reconciliation, Scripture reminds us, "And all these things are from God, who reconciled us to himself through Christ and gave us the ministry of reconciliation.

Adult Choir

Our choir season will resume Feb. 18th and continue until Easter. We will practice two pieces which we will sing for Holy Week. (Good Friday and Easter) Practices take place every Saturday from 5-5:45. (Before Saturday evening worship) Even if you won't be here for Easter this year, I would like to invite you to come and go as you are able. This is a great fellowship opportunity around an activity so many of us enjoy.

Council Meeting Devotion - February

⁹ Jesus told this parable to certain people who trusted in themselves (that they were righteous) and looked down on others: ¹⁰ "Two men went up to the temple courts to pray. One was a Pharisee, and the other was a tax collector. ¹¹ The Pharisee stood and prayed about himself like this: 'God, I thank you that I am not like other people, robbers, evildoers, adulterers, or even like this tax collector. ¹² I fast twice a week. I give a tenth of all my income.' ¹³ "However the tax collector stood at a distance and would not even lift his eyes up to heaven, but was beating his chest and saying, 'God, be merciful to me, a sinner!' ¹⁴ "I tell you, this man went home justified rather than the other, because everyone who exalts himself will be humbled, but the one who humbles himself will be exalted." (Luke 18:9-14 EHV)

Two guys walked up to the temple. No, it's not the start of a lame joke. I promise. Two guys walked up to the temple fully convinced of something. The Pharisee was fully convinced he was perfect. In his mind, he didn't get caught up in all kinds of temptations like others did. In his mind, he was a model citizen. His acts of service to God were a part of his weekly routine. The Tax collector was also fully convinced of something concerning himself. He was a sinner. He beat himself up just thinking about all the times he had fallen into temptation. He was fully convinced he was not a model citizen. (Remember how the Pharisee gave thanks he wasn't like the tax collector) Two guys were fully convinced. One was fully convinced of his own righteousness. The other fully convinced of his own unworthiness.

In his first epistle, John reminds us, "If we say we have no sin, we deceive ourselves, and the truth is not in us. ⁹ If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just to forgive us our sins and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness." (1 John 1:8-9) These words match the parable Jesus told quite nicely, don't they. It will never do for mankind to declare themselves righteous or to deem themselves the cream of the crop; better than the rest. Such thoughts of grandeur or perfection must be squashed by the fact that "All have sinned and fall short of the glory of God." (Romans 3:23) The season of Lent especially serves as a season to reflect on our sins and our deep need for help. Don't deceive yourself. Don't cover over your sins or try to excuse them. See the weight Jesus carried as he carried your sins, every last one of them. See the punishment he endured to atone for your sins. Like the tax collector, stand at a distance, humble and contrite; fully convinced you are a sinner.

The tax collector was fully convinced of another thing. Not concerning himself, but concerning God. "The sacrifices God wants are a broken spirit. A broken and crushed heart, O God, you will not despise." (Psalm 51:17) The tax collector brought his crushed heart to God confident in the Lord's mercy and forgiveness. Even if the whole world condemned him, he trusted the Lord would forgive him and bless him with a new heart and a new spirit. The same is true for you too. Be fully convinced of God's mercy. Confess your sins to him and be fully convinced that your sins are forgiven. Jesus, who bought you back with his blood, makes this point certain. The tax collector prayed, 'God, be merciful to me, a sinner!' Jesus reassures us, "this man went home justified." Just as you are fully convinced you are a sinner, be fully convinced that God is merciful and that he has cleansed you from all unrighteousness.
